Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Timber Cove County Water District

Our water system failed to monitor as required for drinking water standards during the past year and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Even though this failure was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 2022, we did not complete all testing for Lead and Copper and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time.
- The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, how many samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

- If you have health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

The district's lead operator mistakenly misidentified the due date for Lead and Copper Sampling within the district and failed to conduct the required testing for 2022. The Lead Operator has created a "Sampling Requirements & Reminders Guide" for all

required tests and their intervals to be stored at the Plant and reviewed by all operators to ensure all monitoring is completed on time. The district will be conducting the samples this year during the required monitoring period of June-September.

Secondary Notification Requirements

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- **SCHOOLS:** Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- **RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS** (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- **BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS:** Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.
